- The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has confirmed that, as of 9am 21 April, 535,342 tests have concluded, with 18,206 tests on 20 April. 397,670 people have been tested of which 129,044 tested positive. As of 5pm on 20 April, of those hospitalised in the UK who tested positive for coronavirus, 17,337 have sadly died.
- DHSC will publish updated data on <u>this page</u> on a daily basis each afternoon until further notice. And PHE is now hosting a revised dashboard on <u>gov.uk</u>
- Today's Downing Street press conference will be led by Health Secretary Matt Hancock. He will be joined by England's deputy chief medical officer Professor Jonathan Van-Tam, and Professor John Newton, national co-ordinator of the UK coronavirus testing programme.

- To simplify sourcing information relevant to the social care sector, a new collection page has been created on gov.uk bringing all the guidance relevant to them together into one place.
