- The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has confirmed that, as of 9am on 26 April, 669,850 tests have concluded, with 29,058 tests carried out on 25 April. 543,413 people have been tested, of whom 152,840 have tested positive. As of 5pm on 25 April, of those hospitalised in the UK who tested positive for coronavirus, 20,732 have sadly died. (At time of writing, GOV.UK page not yet updated with 27 April stats).
