

Please see the update below from Public Health England for 14 April.

- The **Department of Health and Social Care** (DHSC) has confirmed that, as of 9am on 14 April, 382,650 tests have concluded, with 14,982 tests carried out on 13 April. 302,599 people have been tested, of whom 93,873 tested positive. As of 5pm on 13 April, of those hospitalised in the UK who tested positive for coronavirus, 12,107 have died.
- **DHSC** will publish updated data on [this page](#) on a daily basis each afternoon until further notice. Please be aware that tests are now being prioritised for those who require hospital care for pneumonia or acute respiratory illness – while continuing to investigate outbreaks, ie where several cases are connected, especially in a particular setting such as a care home. This change is being reflected in the surveillance data we report which will monitor, support and inform the public health actions we are taking while no longer providing a running commentary of individual cases, or individual deaths.
- Today's Downing Street press conference is being hosted by Chancellor of the Exchequer Rishi Sunak. And he is joined by Prof Stephen Powis, medical director for NHS England and Prof Yvonne Doyle, medical director for PHE. The Chancellor has announced that the Health Secretary will provide an update on social care tomorrow.
- **'Looking out for each other'**

This campaign is to inform those **who are well and not at risk**, on the things that they can do to help support their friends and neighbours who need to stay at home because of Coronavirus (COVID-19).

The Looking Out For Each Other assets explain how people can help friends, family and neighbours in isolation safely. They direct to gov.uk/safehelp for more information.

The assets explain that if you are well, you should only leave the house for one of four reasons, including to provide care or to help a vulnerable person. They also tell you what actions you should take to help vulnerable people safely.
